

Thank you so much for your interest in becoming a host family for one or more of the Weyburn Beavers' players.

Background information for Host Families:

1. Beavers Season

Beavers season is relatively short with players will start arriving in Weyburn around May 25th. The regular season is completed at the end of July and playoffs are done mid August at which time players will be leaving to return to college.

2. Beavers Players

As you may have noticed from our roster on our website, Beaver players are currently attending and playing at universities and colleges all across Canada and the USA. These players share a common goal in that they are all combining their pursuit of the sport they love with a commitment to completing their college education. This requires dedication and commitment and, for the most part, you will find that they are admirable young men that are polite, respectful, and appreciative of you opening your home to them for the summer.

3. Expectations of a Host Family

Because the Beavers schedule has them playing around 50 games in just 70 days they are extremely busy with games and travel. The principal role of a host family will be to provide food and accommodation. With the demands of their game and practice schedule players require a sleeping accommodation separate from the family. Host families can, but are not expected to, prepare meals for their players although they are expected to ensure that nutritious food is made available for them to prepare their own meals when necessary.

On occasion host families can assist with transportation by dropping their player(s) off at the ballpark, but for the most part players tend to make their own arrangements.

4. Compensation offered to Host Families

Host families will be compensated \$350 per month and provided with a family pass to all Beavers home games. As well, in the past, host families have enjoyed a discount card from Boston Pizza valid through our ball season as well as receiving a generous meat hamper from Western Prime Meats for every player you billet. If there are any up and coming ball players in your family, Beaver players may also serve as excellent mentors and coaches for some informal instruction in the back yard.
